Ream has been with Aziza's Place for 7 years now. He joined AP in September 2010 at the age of 10 and turned 17 in August. Ream has five siblings and lives with his single mother in a small house provided by another NGO active in the area. His family needs our ongoing support as his mother makes \$5 per day, working on the garbage dumpsites.

Before joining AP, Ream had not had the opportunity to attend school. Due to the difficult home situation, helping his mother on the dumpsites was necessary for his family's survival.

Since he joined AP, Ream has been catching up at school, now in the third grade of secondary school, and has developed a very good level of English. He also happily participates in all our extracurricular activities such as karate, swimming and skateboarding. Recently, he started picking up the guitar and we are hoping to see him help start a band with the other children at AP.





Expanding our programs... New healthcare and outreach collaboration

We are excited to share some great news!

We have started a collaboration with **Projects Abroad**: every three weeks, our new partner will come on-site to train our children and visit our communities to provide healthcare services and training.

This month we had our first full day working with them. We organised visits to our communities, together with Dr. Rady, to assess the situation on the ground. During the next visit, Dr. Rady will start training our community members and provide health checks to everyone. We also welcomed his team to Aziza's Place for their first training session with our children. The children learned about how to wash their hands and why. They also learned about the importance of clean drinking water; why it is essential, and how to make sure it is drinkable.

We want to thank Projects Abroad for their support to our NGO and we look forward to a long-lasting collaboration!




T-shirts voting results!
